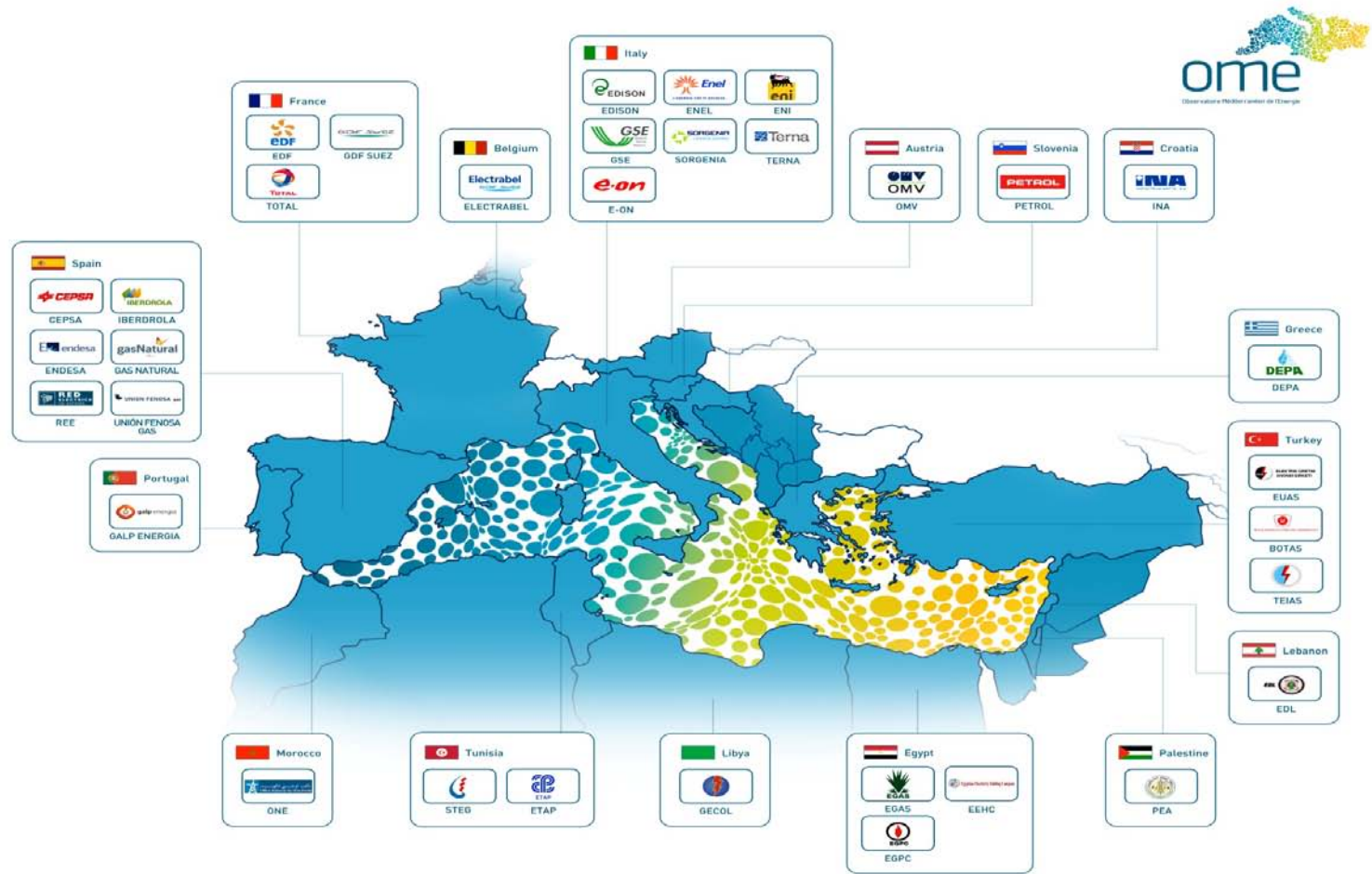

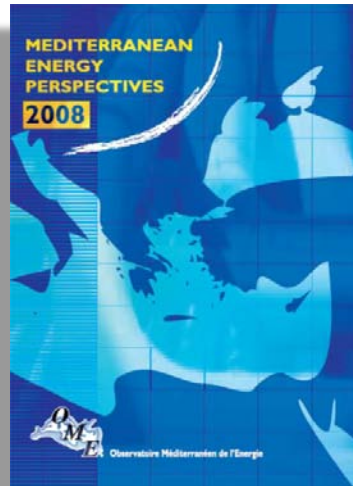

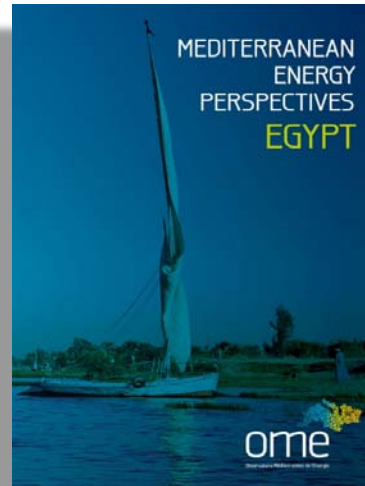

WP8: background and rationale

- One of the main goals of the BETTER project is to establish a **stakeholder network** in order to foster RES cooperation and knowledge transfer
- **The engagement of practitioners is key** to make sure that the project outcomes will be **of immediate use to EU and other stakeholders**, and lead to **concrete action**
- To reach this goal, **a focused WP has been designed**, which intends to **promote a dialogue** with a **diversified set of stakeholders**, in order to **deliver action-oriented results**

- Three main components:
 - **Stakeholder Engagement:** to establish a two-way dialogue between the project consortium and the affected stakeholders and to make sure that their needs and expectations are correctly reflected in the project deliverables
 - Stakeholder engagement plan, which includes their engagement modes
 - **Creating synergies with other initiatives:** dialogue and exchange with relevant projects and initiatives to avoid duplications and advance concrete action
 - Attend other consortia's meetings and events, organise joint events
 - **Stakeholder consultation:** to present and discuss project assumptions and project findings with different stakeholder category groups
 - A series of bilateral meetings in the EU and third countries + 2 regional workshops in EU and 3 outside the EU; 1 side-event

Activities conducted so far

- **CIEMAT** presented the project and the stakeholder consultation component **at the international workshop on « Implementing Article 9 of the directive 2009/28/EC »** held in Barcelona on 22 March 2012
- **OME** presented the project to its members during the **Renewable Energy Committee meeting** held in Casablanca on 26 April 2012
- **CIEMAT** presented the project at the **Summer Workshop of ESTELA**, Brussels 25 June 2012
- Still looking for **additional stakeholders** to enlarge the consultation platform (The French CdC Climat declared its interest to join the stakeholders network)

- **Large and diversified group of stakeholders =>** need to meet different (opposite?) expectations
- **Huge effort required to solicitate the « right » stakeholders at the right time**
 - **A Stakeholder Engagement Plan** is going to be prepared
- **Economic crisis in the EU combined with a policy framework in evolution in many North African countries =>** there is a risk that investors might feel demotivated
 - **A risk and contingency plan** has been prepared and will be regularly updated
- Need to **avoid duplication/redundancies** compared to other EU projects/ongoing initiatives
 - A specific task within WP8 will deal with **creating synergies** with other initiatives



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
